The Partnership for Research and Innovation in the Health System (PRIHS)


- designed to align the knowledge production efforts of researchers with the evidence needs of the health system
- achieved by providing opportunities for researchers to propose the implementation of promising solutions to priority health system challenges in collaboration with Strategic Clinical Networks (SCNs) and Integrated Provincial Programs (IPPs)



PRIHS Digital Health


Key objectives of the PRIHS Digital Health Program:

- Translate research evidence that has been pilot tested and has strong evidence of clinical effectiveness
- The solution will address a priority health system challenge in Alberta as articulated by the SCNs and Integrated Provincial Programs in their Transformational Roadmaps.
- Generate the evidence needed to identify and accelerate the spread and/or scale of evidence-based solutions that close care gaps to foster more efficient and/or effective use of health care resources.






New to PRIHS – Focus on Digital Health



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


Collect, sense, measure, connect, and distribute valuable information effectively and efficiently

Strategic Clinical Networks

- Serve as enduring structures for advancing innovations in these domains – set research and innovation priorities, articulate evidence needs, and identify promising solutions that are ready for testing and evaluation.

Strategic Clinical Networks in PRIHS

Why link your research with an SCN? Involving knowledge users in your grants gives you a competitive advantage

SCNS can help navigate/facilitate interactions between researchers and the health care system

SCNs have diverse stakeholder input and have provincial reach

SCNs can help applicants access critical support structures and health system expertise as early as possible in the PRIHS lifecycle

SCNs are a catalyst for knowledge translation and can effect change that has a real impact

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Primary Lead (Applicant Representative)

Co-Lead (Co-Applicant Representative) holds an academic and/or research appointment at an Alberta-based Post-Secondary Institution

Collaborators

- For-Profit Organizations
- Government Entities

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- Not-for-Profit Organization
- Association/Consortium/Society

• at least one co-lead from the SCN or Integrated Provincial Program Leadership Team

Project Eligibility & Funding

Address a priority as outlined in the SCN and Integrated Provincial Program Transformational Roadmaps;

Consist of one or more evidence-based digital health solution(s) that can be formulated into an implementation study leading to the development of an innovative care model;

Be supported by strong evidence of clinical effectiveness (generated from pilot testing in Alberta (preferable) or another health care setting);

Include key Project milestones based on metrics and deliverables; and

Can demonstrate a significant positive impact on the utilization of health resources within the timeframe of a PRIHS grant i.e. tests a solution that can likely generate cost savings and/or help avoid future costs

Funding

- <u>\$7 million</u> in the PRIHS Digital Health competition
- No maximum budget for each proposal
- The Project term is up to three years (2023 – 26)
- Proposals with project terms less than 3 years are welcome to apply

Application Process

Phase 1 EOI Development January to April 2022

Prospective Primary Leads connect with Strategic Clinical Networks (SCNs) or Integrated Provincial Programs to discuss ideas

High potential opportunities invited to submit an EOI

Submission Deadline April 8, 2022 4:00pm MT

Each SCN selects up to two (2) projects to advance to Phase 2

Decision Communicated May 6, 2022 **Phase 2** Full Application May to July 2022

Primary Leads invited to submit a full proposal

Submission Deadline July 26, 2022 4:00pm MT


Ten (10) Projects Advance to Phase 3

Decision Communicated October 7, 2022 ×

Phase 3 Den Presentations December 5 - 9, 2022

Invited to present proposals to the PRIHS Digital Health Selection Committee.

PRIHS Steering Committee approves all funding recommendations



Decision Communicated Week of January 3, 2023

U of C Internal Submission Processes

Phase One: Expression of Interest

- No internal approvals required
- Submit directly to the relevant SCN(s) by April 8 at 4:00pm MST

Phase Two: Full Application

- Complete internal approvals through the <u>Research Management System</u>
- Submit full application for review and institutional approval
- Internal Deadline: July 21 at 12:00pm MST

Phase Three: Den Presentations

No internal approvals required

Internal Peer Review


- Full application and Den Presentation Stages
